## **October Mini-Show**

#### **CACTUS: ECHINOPSIS**

Native to South America, Echinopsis are known commonly as hedgehog, sea urchin, Easter lily, or peanut cactus (*E. chamaecereus*). "Echinos" means "hedgehog" or "sea urchin," with "opsis" meaning "appearance."

They differ from Echinocactus in the length of their flower tubes. Echinopsis have long flower tubes much larger than would be proportionate to the size of the small plants. They bear lovely flowers ranging in color from white to pink, orange, and red. Keep the plants dry in fall and winter and between waterings in spring and summer.

Crassula are one of the most common household plant with many varieties know just as "Jade Plant" or "Jade Tree." This group includes *Crassula portulacea argentea* (all green variety), *C. portulacea minima* (a dwarf form), and *C. portulacea* "Tricolor Jade" (a variegated version). Most Crassula are very easy to grow and are good for beginner growers.

### SUCCULENT: TYLECODON/CRASSULA

Ranging from Namibia to South Africa, Tylecodon have caudiciforms or thick stems. Tylecodons are deciduous and are winter-growers that require bright light and some warmth during this period. They can tolerate temperatures down to 32°F for short periods of time but need temperatures up to 80°F periodically.
