

#### **January Program**

#### **Superbloom Trifecta!**



Most gardeners are aware that South Africa contains extraordinary plant diversity: approximately a tenth of the World's vascular plant flora grows natively in South Africa. The South and Western parts of the Cape are especially rich in succulents (and bulbs!) however this area was subjected to great drought stress for most of this Millennium. Until 2022, that is, when heavy winter rains resulted in a fantastic display of annuals, bulbs, perennials and succulents we call a "Super bloom"...I was so smitten that I returned in 2023 and again in 2024--just a few months ago. Each year seemed to outdo the previous one. Seeing is believing--the technicolor audacity of Namagualand super bloom must be seen to be believed! I hope I can convey a taste of it in my presentation!

#### **Superbloom Trifecta**

Panayoti Kelaidis is a plant explorer, gardener and public garden administrator associated with Denver Botanic Gardens where he is now Director of Outreach. He began his career at DBG in 1980 as curator of the Rock Alpine Garden, where he designed and oversaw the initial plantings of this extensive garden. Garden Design Magazine has rated this garden as the best public rock garden in North America. He has designed plantings for many of the gardens at DBG, as well as being part of the design team at Centennial garden and has designed the Watersmart knot gardens at Denver's Civic Center as part of Denver Mayor Hickenlooper's Water Conservation initiative.

He has introduced hundreds of native ornamentals from throughout the Western United States to general horticulture. He has taken five collecting trips to South Africa researching the high mountain and steppe flora there, as well as travels to the Andes, the Himalaya (Pakistan, Sikkim, Tibet and China), as well as travels throughout much of Europe, Central Asia (Uzbekistan, Mongolia and and Kazakhstan) the Caucasus and Turkey. Perhaps the best known of Panayoti's introductions are the many showy hardy ice plants: several dozen of these are now available at garden centers across America and in other parts of the world.

Panayoti has been party to the discovery of a number of species of plants new to science and has received numerous awards. He has lectured in nearly 150 cities in nine countries, and has been featured in many television, newspaper and magazine pieces. He believes that gardening is humanity's best way to gain an appreciation of nature and natural processes. In an increasingly urbanized and polluted world, horticulture is, perhaps, the best way to create a sustainable future for mankind and our planet.



Our three categories are cactus, succulents and dish gardens. Remember, for cactus and succulent categories, an entry should just be one plant (or plant with its pups). If there are several plantings in a pot (even of the same species), that is a dish garden. A dish garden can have several plants of the same species, or a mix of species. Dish gardens can also have playful elements, such as fairy gardens, etc.

If you are participating in the Mini Show, please plan on arriving on time to get your plant set up and give the members time to vote! Voting is over at 7 pm when the speaker starts. Winners are announced after the speaker.

**Spiral Cactus**: Cacti are a large group of plants, many of which are native to dry regions across the world. Their very minimal care needs, unique foliage, and bohemian-feel make th.ese plants a must have for plant lovers. There are a few varieties that have a lovely spiral or twisted form, such as Cereus forbesii 'spiralis', which is a vibrant member of the Cereus genus! Another interesting but different spiral is the Eulychnia Castanea Spiralis.

**Aeonium**: The Aeonium is a fairly common succulent, but one of my favorites, especially this time of year because it is summer dormant and enjoys this time of year when it gets more water. While they can be really big, I am sure some of you have some smaller examples that will be easy to bring to the Mini Show
